1. PARAGRAPH NUMBER AND TITLE:

3-9-9, TAKEOFF CLEARANCE

- 2. BACKGROUND: Radio communications transfer may occur prior to an aircraft crossing all runways enroute to or reaching the approach end of the assigned runway. Stating the runway to be used in conjunction with a control instruction to an arriving or departing aircraft also enhances safety. Restating the crossing clearance decreases the likelihood of an aircraft departing the wrong runway
- 3. EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: This change amends the required phraseology for issuing aircraft departure instructions. This change cancels and incorporates N JO 7110.473, Takeoff Clearances, effective July 22, 2007.

4. CHANGE:

3-9-9. TAKEOFF CLEARANCE 3-9-9. TAKEOFF CLEARANCE

a. When only one runway is active, issue takeoff clearance.

a. When issuing a clearance for takeoff, first state the runway number followed by the takeoff clearance.
