What?: Volunteers are needed to help clear winter debris, clear brush and repair trails and facilities in the 1980 blast zone northwest of the volcano. Efforts will focus on trails in the vicinity of the Johnston Ridge Observatory (JRO) and Coldwater Lake.

When?: Registration will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday morning and the work party will continue until 3:30 p.m. Following the work party, there will be a Mount St. Helens Institute volunteer and member appreciation potluck and barbecue (bring a potluck dish to share). Volunteers and MSHI members are invited to camp out with us on Saturday night, and join us for an optional geologist guided tour of the Boundary Trail east of JRO on Sunday, July 13th (8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.) The Sunday guided tour and hike will start at 8:30 a.m. on July 13th at Boundary Trailhead.

Where?: For the Saturday morning work party and Sunday hike, meet at the Boundary Trailhead located in the NE corner of the Johnston Ridge Observatory parking lot (this is far left corner of the parking lot from where you drive in). To find Johnston Ridge head east on State Route 504 from Interstate 5 and follow the signs east all the way to the end of the road. See <u>Monument Recreation</u> <u>Map</u>
