

Summer Solstice Lewis River Trail Spectacular

(Saturday, June 21, 2008)



Help clear storm debris and repair damaged trails in old-growth forest SE of the volcano.

What?: Volunteers are needed to help clear winter debris and repair storm damaged trails in old-growth forests along the Lewis River southeast of Mount St. Helens. Efforts will focus on the Lewis River, Curly Creek Falls and Big Creek Falls Trails.

When?: Saturday, June 21st—meet at the parking lot in front of the closed information station at Pine Creek Work Center at 9:00 a.m. The work party will continue until 3:00 p.m. Following the work party, volunteers will return to the Pine Creek Work Center for a volunteer-appreciation potluck and barbecue at 3:30 p.m. (please bring a side dish or dessert to share).

Where?: Meet in the parking lot in front of the closed information center at Pine Creek Work Center. The work center is located on Forest Road 90 about 18 ½ miles east of the town of Cougar and just west of the intersection of Forest Roads 90 and 25. See [Monument Recreation Map](#)

Who?: Students, community groups, businesses, and volcano enthusiasts of all ages are needed to come out and join in the fun! Please bring a sack lunch, potluck dish to share, water bottle(s), and work gloves. Please wear sturdy hiking or work boots and come dressed for “rain or shine” weather.
