How to Apply ASPEN GUARD STATION ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE PROGRAM

Applications are accepted annually from January 1 - March 1. Selection and notification are made by no later than May 1. Residencies for those selected are scheduled June through September of the same year on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications must be stamped as received by the deadline

at the following address: Ann Bond, San Juan Public Lands Center, 15 Burnett Court, Durango, CO 81301. Please follow the below instructions carefully.

Put together four packets of the following (collated and stapled):

- 1. A 1-2-page resume with a summary of creative works, exhibitions, awards, etc.
- 2. A listing of titles of submitted images, including actual sizes and media.
- 3. A 1-page statement describing:
 - What you hope to achieve from a residency;
 - o How you would spend your time at the cabin;
 - How you would share your work or talents with the community during or following your residency;
 - Your ability to work in a primitive setting.
- 4. Include samples of your work (identified with your name and address) as follows:
 - Visual artists: One set of 6 digital images on CD.
 Images <u>must</u> be saved as 72 dpi jpgs, <u>no larger than</u>
 1440 X 960 pixels in size.
 - Musicians or composers: One CD.
 - o Performers or dancers: One DVD.
 - Writers: Not more than 5 pages of text, stories, articles, or poems (four copies collated of each)
- 5. A self-addressed, stamped envelope for the return of sample materials, if desired.
- 6. Your email address, so that we can notify you that your application has been received, and later, notify you as to whether you were selected.
