SUBJECT: Inpatient Rehabilitation Facility (IRF) Annual Update: Prospective Payment System (PPS) Pricer Changes for FY 2007

#### I. GENERAL INFORMATION

- **A. Background:** On August 7, 2001, we published in the **Federal Register**, a final rule that established the PPS for IRFs, as authorized under §1886(j) of the Social Security Act (the Act). In that final rule, we set forth per discharge Federal rates for Federal fiscal year (FY) 2002. These IRF PPS payment rates became effective for cost reporting periods beginning on or after January 1, 2002. Annual updates to the IRF PPS rates are required by §1886(j)(3)(C) of the Act.
- **B. Policy:** The FY 2007 IRF PPS Final Rule published on August 18, 2006, sets forth the prospective payment rates applicable for IRFs for FY 2007. A new IRF PRICER software package will be released prior to October 1, 2006 that will contain the updated rates that are effective for claims with discharges that fall within October 1, 2006 through September 30, 2007. The new revised Pricer program must be installed timely to ensure accurate payments for the IRF PPS claims with discharges occurring on or after October 1, 2006 through September 30, 2007.

**PRICER Updates:** For IRF PPS fiscal year (FY) 2007, (October 1, 2006 – September 30, 2007)

- o The standard Federal rate is \$12,981
- o The fixed loss amount is \$5,534
- o The labor-related share is 75.612 percent
- o The non-labor related share is 24.388 percent
- o Urban national average CCR is 0.484
- o Rural national average CCR is 0.600

#### **Hold Harmless**

There were 32 IRFs identified in FY 2006 that received a hold harmless adjustment of 12.76 percent. For FY 2007 these same 32 providers will get a hold harmless adjustment of 6.38 percent. (Indicated by a Y in the Temp. Relief field, data element 17 in the provider specific file).

In addition, one of the IRFs above (49T005 will get the special wage index and the hold harmless adjustment) that would qualify for the hold harmless policy, but would experience higher payments with the second year of the hold harmless adjustment of 6.38 percent than they would have experienced had they been paid under their rural designation in FY 2006, including the FY 2005 rural adjustment of 19.14 percent. In other words, we are essentially capping this facility's payments under the hold harmless policy at this level. CMS will provide the FIs with the applicable special wage index value for this IRF (and for

any other IRFs we may later discover would receive higher payments as a result of the hold harmless policy). This special wage index value should be used instead of the FY 2007 CBSA wage index value for determining FY 2007 IRF PPS payments for this IRF.
