



- Operate and maintain recreation sites to health and safety standards.
- Eliminate maintenance backlog at recreation sites.



7 Steps of RS-FMP

Steps 1–4: Niche development and internal analysis identify operational efficiencies and rank sites

Step 5 & 6: Development of site specific tasks to meet goals, produce analysis document


Step 7: Invite public participation to implement & improve 5 year Program of Work



Site Ranking Steps 1-4

Districts rank sites based on:

- Conformance to niche
- Environmental sustainability
- Financial sustainability
- Degree of support to/by communities





Management Efficiencies and Site Ranking

Step 1: Prepare Site Inventory Data

Step 2: Develop Recreation Program Niche

Step 3-4: Identify Management Efficiencies and Rank Sites


Districts rank sites based on:

Management Options Step 5

District staff proposes site-specific actions to:

- Come in line with niche
- Decrease costs
- Increase revenues
- Change operation of some facilities
 So that sites conform to niche
 and the program is efficient and financially sustainable (RS-FMP goals)



Produce Analysis Document Step 6

Forest completes analysis document with 5 year Program of Work

Forest Supervisor and Regional Forester concur that internal analysis is complete.





Public Participation Step 7

Forest invites local communities and stakeholders to help implement and improve the 5 year Program of Work, while still meeting RS-FMP goals.


A *Niche* is: RS-FMP

with unique social and ecological features of the land (supply).










Forest Recreation Program *Niche*
