The workshops will help shape the future of off-highway vehicle (OHV) use in the Black Hills National Forest.

- **Spearfish, South Dakota:** Wednesday, November 15, 2006 at 6:00 p.m., located at the Holiday Inn Hotel and Convention Center, Cedar Room, I-90 at Exit 14.
- **Rapid City, South Dakota:** Thursday, November 16, 2006 at 6:00 p.m., located at the Ramkota Hotel, Pactola Room, 2111 North LaCrosse Street.

The public is asked to consider and submit answers to the following questions before the meetings:

1. What does this forest offer in terms of outstanding travelway opportunities and experiences?
2. In what ways are you satisfied with the forest's travelways and why?
3. What is the role of the community in helping to provide a quality travelway system?
