Higher Elevations: In the High Sierra nighttime temperatures are often in the low 30's during the summer with the possibility of dropping into the 20's. The backcountry traveler should have a sleeping bag rated between 15-30 degrees, depending on their personal comfort level. The daytime temperatures vary widely even to becoming quite warm. It is best to layer clothing to be prepared for a wide range of conditions. Thundershowers are common so you should bring a waterproof jacket and a tent or tarp.
