## ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR RESTRICTING THE OCCUPANCY AND USE ON THE HIAWATHA NATIONAL FOREST

Under the authority of the Act of Congress of June 4, 1897, as amended (16 USC 551), and the Secretary of Agriculture's Regulations 36 CFR 261.50(a) and or (b), the following acts and omissions are prohibited on the Hiawatha National Forest.

## A. Storing Equipment

- 1. Storing, mooring, or leaving a boat or raft over 24 hours. 36 CFR 261.58(p)
- B. Parking
  - 1. Parking in violation of posted instructions. 36 CFR 261.58(g)
- C. Drugs and Alcohol
  - 1. Possessing, storing, or transporting cannabis plant (s) or any controlled substance derived from the manufacture of cannabis plant (s). 36 CFR 261.58(t)
  - 2. Possessing a beverage, which is defined as an alcoholic beverage by state law by persons under twenty-one (21) years of age. 36 CFR 261.58(bb)

This order applies to all lands of the Hiawatha National Forest.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons will be exempt from the order:

- 1. Any Federal, State, or Local officers, or members of an organized rescue or firefighting force, engaged in the performance of an official duty.
- 2. Persons with a valid permit in their possession and signed by the District Ranger or Forest Supervisor specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act. This exemption does not apply to sections C above.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 and imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both under the authority of Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3559 and 3571.

This Order will be subject to review within 5 years of above date.
