Use Caution on Forest Roads

OHV Operators Must Comply with State Regulations

Visitors, specifically hunters, are encouraged to drive with caution as they travel on the Flathead National Forest.

Several roads on the Forest are slippery due to recent moisture and road maintenance activities.

The East-side Hungry Horse Reservoir Road, Forest Road #38, is slippery and travelers are encouraged to use the road on the west side of the reservoir if possible.

Vehicles pulling stock or recreation trailers should use caution and pay attention to turns and when meeting other vehicles. All travelers are encouraged to slow down and allow time to respond to seasonal changes in the road.

All off-highway vehicle, OHV, travel on forest roads must comply with State of Montana regulations concerning OHV use and travel. The vehicle must have a title and license plate, as well as head light, brake light and mirror. The operator of the vehicle must have and possess a valid

state driver's license. No cross-country travel is permitted on the Flathead National Forest.
