


# **OUTCOME OF TRASAS/2**







Agenda Item 1: Report on significant international aviation developments

- i) outcome of and follow-up on the 36th Session of the Assembly of ICAO;
- ✓ Noted the A36 outcome and endorsed the proposed amendment to its ToRs to accommodate Assembly Resolution A36-14 (paragraphs 1.1 and 6.2 of ToRs refers).
- ii) outcome of APANPIRG/18, EANPG/49, NAT SPG/43, GREPECAS/14; and the NAT SPG SPECIAL 2007 Meeting.
- ✓ Reviewed outcomes of the PIRGs and discussions on the way forward on WP/5 [Data Link Harmonisation] recorded under Agenda Item 4
- iii) progress on global implementation of Performance Based Navigation (PBN);
- ✓ Noted work being done in the Regions on the implementation of PBN as a tool that enables efficient utilisation of airspace





- iv) preparations for Beijing Olympics.
- ✓ Noted the airspace improvements that had been made by China and the Russian Federation
- ✓ ICAO BKK invited to include the issue of new entry/exit points in China on the agenda of the next CMRI meeting and that Kazakhstan be invited to that meeting
- ✓ Concerns raised by Russian Federation on coordination of nonscheduled flights during the Olympics for overflight applications
- ✓ China and Russian Federation were invited by TRASAS to conduct bilateral meetings to coordinate the issue of Overflight Permissions and Airport Slots, as necessary, in order to ensure efficiency of the existing system during the Beijing Olympics and consider finalising agreement not later than June 2008
  - ✓ Russian Federation proposed that coordination meeting should take place before late April 2008
  - ✓ China agreed that they would consider the proposal by Russian Federation and give feedback through the contact point with the Russian Federation



#### Agenda Item 2: Implementation of RVSM, including interface issues


- ✓ Noted outcome of 32nd Meeting of the ICAO RVSM Implementation Task force regarding the implementation of RVSM in the Chinese airspace and agreed to the request by Russian Federation to be invited to the 33<sup>rd</sup> Meeting (9-11 April 2008)
- ✓ Noted the proposal for amendment to Annex 2 Tables of Cruising Levels
- ✓ Noted the status of RVSM Implementation in Asia/Pacific Region
- ✓ Noted the work being carried out concerning future RVSM implementation in the Russian Federation
- ✓ Noted the full applicability of the ICAO provisions (Annex 2) within the airspace over the High Seas
- ✓ Noted the proposal of IATA to improve the transition to/from RVSM airspace over the Arctic Ocean area






Agenda Item 3: Work currently underway to enhance the ATS route network

- ✓ Noted the ATM Outcome from GREPECAS 14 Meeting
- ✓ Noted the outcomes of the 5<sup>th</sup> Special ATS Coordination Meeting China, Mongolia, The Russian Federation and IATA (CMRI/5)
- ✓ Noted the latest version of the Asia and Pacific ATS Route Catalogue
- ✓ Noted the summary of 4th Cross-Polar Working Group (CPWG/4) and expressed appreciation for all the work that had been accomplished so far by the CPWG and encouraged more cooperation between all parties concerned
  - ✓ Appreciation expressed by Russian Federation to USA for the removal of buffer times on 29 February 2008 which has enabled increased efficiency in operations and also expressed hope that USA would remove buffer times for Trans-Eastern routes
- ✓ Noted with appreciation the Trial of Air Traffic Flow Management Procedures for Polar Fixes DEVID, RAMEL NIKIN and ORVIT
- ✓ Noted the progress of regional partnerships for increasing efficiency & reducing greenhouse gas emissions in aviation such as AIRE and ASPIRE and recognised the importance of these initiatives


**Draft TRASAS Conclusion 2/2 – Improved Surveillance and Communications in the Northern Airspace**



**Draft TRASAS Conclusion 2/3 – RNP for Cross-Polar and Trans- East Operations** 


- That TRASAS invites all PIRGs concerned to consider actions that will harmonise the application of separation standards and a means to achieve:
- a) implementation of the RNP-10 provisions in the airspaces covering the Cross-Polar and Trans-East routes/operations as a short-term/medium-term action;
- b) implementation of the RNP-4 provisions in the same airspaces as described above, as a medium-term/long-term improvement; and
- c) amend, as appropriate, the provisions of Regional Supplementary Procedures and the Air Navigation Plans.
- (Secretariat note: short-term, medium-term and long-term to be defined in text, RF assured IATA that if they could implement earlier, they would.)

  - ✓ RUS confirmed that they would look into proposals provided by IATA and coordinate further simplification directly with IATA


