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

VA Approach to Mental Health Care

Through decades of research and treatment, the VA health care system has learned much about how to help veterans fully recover from mental illness and lead fulfilling lives. To achieve this goal, VA care focuses on (1) increasing the individual's ability to cope successfully with life's challenges, (2) building resilience, and (3) facilitating recovery.



Our Network's Mental Health Care Mission

The mission of the VA Stars & Stripes Healthcare Network Mental Health Service is to provide the highest quality mental health services to veterans treated by our facilities. To accomplish this, we use a recovery-based treatment model. The "Recovery Model" helps veterans with mental illness make choices, learn decision-making and problem-solving skills, and maintain healthy relationships. The model serves to promote the highest level of wellness, happiness, and life satisfaction for the veteran.

Service Delivery

Network mental health care services are delivered by working closely with our medical school affiliates, community partners, and research and clinical "Centers of Excellence." The latter include our Mental Illness Research, Education, and Clinical Center and Center of Excellence for Substance Abuse Treatment and Education, each of which engages in a variety of activities that help improve treatment approaches and patient outcomes.

Mental Health Programs

VA Stars & Stripes Healthcare Network Mental Health Service offers a broad spectrum of mental health programs for veterans.

Programs include:

- Inpatient mental health care
- Residential rehabilitation, including domiciliary care
- Case management for the severely mentally ill
- Geriatric treatment
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and treatment for military sexual trauma
- Substance use disorders services
- Vocational rehabilitation and therapeutic work services
- Homeless veterans outreach, case management, and transitional housing
- Community residential care
- Outreach to veterans returning from Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom
