Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(b), and to protect natural resources and public safety, the following act is prohibited within the Tahoe National Forest. This order is effective August 19, 1998.

Using a motorized vehicle on the forest development trails listed below.

- a. Sand Ridge Trail (Forest Trail 14E11) from Sand Ridge Lake to its intersection with the Hole-in-the Ground Trail (Forest Trail 14E25) in Section 34 of T.18N., R.14E., MDB&M, as shown on the attached map (Exhibit A); and
- b. Hole-in-the Ground Trail (Forest Trail 14E250) from its intersection with Castle Valley Road (Forest Road 80-50) in Section 12 of T.17N., R.14E., MDB&M, to its intersection with Lower Lola Montes Trail (Forest Trail 14E12) in Section 8 of T.17N., R.14E., MDB&M, as shown on the attached map (Exhibit A). 36 CFR 261.55(b).

Using a motorized vehicle or bicycle on the Sand Ridge Trail (14E11) from its intersection with the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail in Section 2 of T.17N., R.14E., MDB&M, to its intersection with the Hole-in-the-Ground Trail in Section 2 of T.17N., R.14E., MDB&M, as shown on the attached map (Exhibit A). 36 CFR 261.55(b).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Persons with disabilities using assistive devices or aids. An assistive device is a piece of equipment, such as a wheelchair, used by a person with a disability on a daily basis to help in the accomplishment of one of life's major functions or activities. The term "wheelchair" is defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act as a "device designed solely for use by a mobility-impaired person for locomotion, that is suitable for use in an indoor pedestrian area." 42 USC 12207(c) (2). A wheelchair may be motorized or non-motorized.
3. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

**These prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.**
