4. Changes at the Enterprise Systems Management Office

Craig Luigart, the VHA's Chief Information Officer, designated Susan Lloyd as Acting Director for the Enterprise Systems Management Office effective April 30. She continues as well as Enterprise Systems Manager (ESM) for Health Data Systems (HDS). 5. Change in Identification of Community Nursing Home Stays in MedSAS Inpatient Datasets

Researchers formerly used bedsection (bedsecn)=80 with station type (statype)=42 to specifically identify community nursing home stays. However, beginning in fiscal year 2006 (FY06), the VA introduced a set of new codes for categorizing treating specialties/bedsections for nursing home care. Presently the single way to identify community nursing home stays is bedsecn=44 with statype=42. Treating specialty code 44 became active on 7/1/2006, while treating specialty code 80 became inactive on 8/2/2006.

6. Under Ascertainment of Medication Use in Pharmacy Datasets

The inability to capture the use of ward stock, or medications maintained by clinics or ward units, at an individual patient level was discussed in a previous VIReC *Insights* (http://www.virec.research.va.gov/HistoricalDocuments/VirecInsights/Insights-v02n2.pdf). The concern about under ascertainment of medication use in pharmacy datasets was recently raised again vis-à-vis medications following surgical procedures.

The Pharmacy Benefits Management Strategic Healthcare Group (PBM/SHG) has identified that medications administered in the operating rooms or procedure suites are not completely reflected in the VA pharmacy datasets (PBM or Decision Support System Pharmacy National Data Extracts [DSS Pharmacy NDEs]) that are used for research at the patient level. This is also true for some medications administered in acute care settings such as the emergency department, post-anesthesia care units and intensive care units. In addition, many intravenous medications administered in outpatient infusion clinics are not always captured. This under representation of specific parenteral agents in the national VA datasets is currently being addressed by the PBM/SHG. Researchers should use caution when examining these medications and others where observed use is far below what is expected in the national pharmacy databases.
