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VA DATA AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS:

1. VA ORD Implementing a VA/DoD Collaborative Research Listserv

The VA Office of Research and Development (ORD) is in the process of implementing a VA/Department of Defense (DoD) Collaborative Research Listserv to foster communications and collaborative research among VA and DoD researchers. The listserv will act as a mechanism for VA and DoD researchers to: (1) discuss research ideas; (2) obtain collaborative research partners; (3) identify researchers in specific areas of research; and (4) establish a source document for research expertise among VA and DoD researchers. To participate in the listserv, researchers should send a completed information form to vadodcri@va.gov (VADoD Collaborative Research Initiative). 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2. OEF/OIF Field Changes in DSS Datasets

The Decision Support Office announced that it will populate the OEF/OIF and the OEF/OIF Return Date fields in the Decision Support System (DSS) National Data Extracts (NDEs) using the Defense Manpower Data Center data from the roster sent to the VA Central Office (VACO) Environmental Health office instead of using VistA data as previously announced by the office. No change is being made to the DSS production data, only to the NDEs. The two new data fields for Operation Enduing Freedom/Operation Iraqi Freedom (OEF/OIF) will be preceded with "DoD" to describe the source. These two fields will be available beginning with fiscal year 2009 (FY09) NDEs.
