## 1. New Treating Specialty Codes for VA Nursing Home Care Unit Admissions

VHA Directive 2005-061, "VA Nursing Home Care Unit (NHCU) Admission Criteria, Service Codes, and Discharge Criteria," was issued December 7, 2005. The directive specifies treating specialty codes that must be implemented effective March 31, 2006. The new codes associate service categories (e.g., rehabilitation) with admission categories (e.g., short-term stay). ## 2. Means Test Thresholds for Calendar Year 2006

VHA Directive 2005-064, dated December 22, 2005, revises the Means Test Thresholds, Medicare Deductible Rate, and Child Income Exclusion for calendar year 2006. ## 3. VHA Directive Redefines Policy for Provider Classification

VHA Directive 2005-059, "Person Class File Taxonomy," was issued December 7, 2005. The directive describes the required classification of VHA providers using Person Class codes in VistA. It explains the taxonomy developed by the American National Standards Institute and the Health Care Financing Administration (now Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services) and adopted by the VHA. ## 4. National Clinical Reminder for OIF/OEF Screening Revised

VHA Directive 2005-055, "Implementation of the National Clinical Reminder for Afghan and Iraq Post-Deployment Screening," issued December 1, 2005, describes the required use of a national clinical reminder to ensure screening by VHA providers of patients identifying themselves as returning from Operation Iraqi Freedom or Operation Enduring Freedom. ## 5. HERC Issues Technical Report on Fee Basis Data

The Health Economics Resource Center (HERC) has issued *HERC Technical Report #18, Fee Basis Data: A Guide for Researchers.* The report describes the eight Fee Basis SAS files produced each year and gives the names and file locations of all Fee Basis variables for FY2004.
