2. The list of VHA Office of Information (OI) top issues for March 2000 includes projects approved by the Information Technology Advisory Committee (ITAC). The ITAC “has recommended approval for Technical Services to work on three requests. Clozapine Registry enhancements will enhance the existing weekly extract to report the manufacturer of generic clozapine to the National Clozapine Coordinating Center as required by FDA. Continuous Improvement Cardiac

Surgery Program Expansion will add data elements to the Surgical Risk Assessment Report to assist in analysis and determination of positive care measures for surgical cardiac patients. The enhancements to the Prosthetics software will improve the ability of VISTA and the national database to track prosthetics devices inventories a need cited in an OIG report.” For more information on this and other top issues from the Office of Information, visit their Web site at: [REDACTED].

3. HCFA’s Research Data Assistance Center (ResDAC) at the University of Minnesota is offering a 3-day course on Medicare data in Minneapolis, MN from June 12-14, 2000. The HCFA course focuses on computing and statistical methods that are appropriate for managing and analyzing administrative health care data. Claims-based research draws on computing, elementary statistics, study design, measurement theory (operationalization), clinical medicine, and health services research. The ResDAC is funded by the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) to assist researchers in gaining access to and understanding of Medicare and Medicaid data that is available from HCFA. ResDAC offers a variety of different courses on using Medicare data in research.
