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VA DATA AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS:

1. VA Research Data Security & Privacy

Researchers should intermittently check the VA Research Data Security & Privacy page of the VA Office of Research and Development (ORD) Web site for updates (http://www.research.va.gov/resources/data-security/). ORD recently added a new category of information, "Checklists, Certification Forms & Other Responsibilities." Researchers are reminded under the category of training information of the VA Research Data Security & Privacy course that is available through the VA Learning Online (VALO) Campus or the Learning Management System (LMS). This course was posted March 15, 2007 and must be completed no later than June 12, 2007.

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2. New Orlando VA Hospital Using Facility Number 675

The new Orlando VA Hospital is using Facility Number 675 and associated suffixes. In recognition of this change, six of the 673 Facility Numbers (Tampa) have been converted to 675 Facility Numbers (Orlando) in the Medical SAS Datasets at the VA's Austin Automation Center (AAC). These changes are retroactive to the beginning of fiscal year 2007 (FY07). 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3. VHA Discontinues Quarterly and Regional Medical SAS Files

Beginning in FY07, the VA's AAC is discontinuing quarterly and regional inpatient and outpatient Medical SAS Datasets since there is no longer any technical need to build intermediate files. As in the past, a single production cumulative dataset for each of the inpatient and outpatient files is updated throughout the fiscal year. 4. New HERC Guidebook Released: Preference Measurement in Economic Analysis

The VA's Health Economics Resource Center (HERC) released on April 2 a new guidebook entitled *Preference Measurement in Economic Analysis*. This guidebook presents an overview of the concepts of preference measurement and quality-adjusted life years (QALYs), and includes such things as recommended criteria by which to select both the methods and measures to use in cost-effectiveness analysis (CEA). 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5. VA Revises Appendices A, B, and C of Schedule for Rating Disabilities

The VA is revising effective April 19 its Schedule for Rating Disabilities, Appendices A, B, and C to include all current diagnostic codes.
