3. ESM Releases Complete Redesign of Web Site

The Office of Enterprise Systems Management (ESM) is part of the Veterans Health Administration Office of Information (VHA OI). The purpose of this office is to work collaboratively with other OI components and VHA Program Offices to develop, implement and monitor the comprehensive portfolios of information technology (IT) systems. The new VA Intranet Web site provides an easy-to-use resource including a record of active software development projects, a VistA software package listing and program-related initiatives, a process description for new IT business service requests, etc. The address is given in the Intranet version of this *Data Issues Brief*.

NON-VA DATA AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS:

5. Proposed CMS DRG Changes for FY08

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) published a new ruling in the August 22 *Federal Register* (http://a257.g.akamaitech.net/7/257/2422/01jan20071800/edocket.access.gpo.gov/2007/07-3820.htm). The rule concerns the CMS inpatient prospective payment system (PPS) that is based on diagnostic-related groups (DRGs). There are four basic changes: (1) identification of 6 conditions, including three serious preventable events, for which CMS will not provide higher payments if the selected condition is not present at admission; (2) creation of 745 new Medicare-Severity DRGs (MS-DRGs) to replace the current 538 DRGs, and an overhaul of the complication/comorbidity list; (3) establishment of 5 new quality measures that hospitals will need to report in FY08 in order to qualify for the full market basket updated in FY09; and (4) the establishment of a new policy to change the way hospitals are paid for medical devices that are recalled or replaced at no or reduced cost to the hospital.
