Data Issues Brief April 2003

1. VA Issues Notice of Privacy Practices Effective April 14, 2003

The Notice of Privacy Practices issued by the Veterans Administration includes statements to patients about possible use of their information for research purposes. The document is available on the Internet at http://www.va.gov/publ/direc/health/notice/ib10-163.pdf

2. VIReC Funded for VA Medicare Data Merge

The VA Information Resource Center (VIReC) has received notice of approval and funding for its proposal to acquire Medicare enrollment and claims data for veterans and to link the Medicare data with VA health care utilization data. Procedures are under development for disseminating the data to VA researchers with approved projects. VIReC will soon announce the availability of the 1999 merged VA and Medicare data, and a second announcement will follow concerning availability of 2000 and 2001 data. 3. Upcoming Workshops on Medicare and Medicaid Data

The Research Data Assistance Center (ResDAC) is offering two workshops at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. CMS 101, "Introduction to the use of Medicare data for research," will be presented May 14-16, 2003; CMS 102, "Conducting research with Medicaid claims data," will be available June 2-4, 2003. CMS 101 is vital background for researchers who have not yet used Medicare data and plan to use the merged VA-Medicare data that will soon be available through VIReC.
