


Figure 7.1. Percent of adults aged 18 years and over who engaged in regular leisure-time physical activity: United States, 1997-2003





Regular leisure-time physical activity is defined as engaging in light-moderate leisure-time physical activity for greater than or equal to 30 minutes at a frequency greater than or equal to five times per week, or engaging in vigorous leisure-time physical activity for greater than or equal to 20 minutes at a frequency greater than or equal to three times per week. The analyses excluded persons with unknown physical activity participation (about 3% of respondents each year). CI is confidence interval. Beginning with the 2003 data, the National Health Interview Survey transitioned to weights derived from the 2000 census. In this Early Release, estimates for 2000-02 were recalculated using weights derived from the 2000 census. See "About This Release" and appendix tables in this release for more details.

DATA SOURCE: Sample Adult Core component of the 1997-2003 National Health Interview Surveys. The estimate for 2003 was based on data collected from January through September.

- From January through September 2003, 33.3% (95% CI = 32.4%-34.2%) of U.S. adults aged 18 years and over engaged in regular leisure-time physical activity. The estimate for January-September was 33.2% in 1997, 30.5% in 1998, 30.6% in 1999, 32.6% in 2000, 32.9% in 2001, and 32.7 in 2002.
- The annual percents of adults aged 18 years and over who engaged in regular leisure-time physical activity increased from 29.9% in 1998 to 31.9% in 2000, but remained stable thereafter.



Figure 7.2. Percent of adults aged 18 years and over who engaged in regular leisure-time physical activity, by age group and sex: United States, January-September 2003





DATA SOURCE: Based on data collected from January-September in the Sample Adult Core component of the 2003 National Health Interview Survey.

- For both sexes combined, the percent of adults who engaged in regular leisure-time physical activity decreased with age.
- For all age groups, women were less likely than men to engage in regular leisure-time physical activity.

DATA SOURCE: Based on data collected from January through September in the Sample Adult Core component of the 2003 National Health Interview Survey.

- The age-sex-adjusted percent of adults who engaged in regular leisure-time physical activity was 25.2% for Hispanic adults, 36.2% for non-Hispanic white adults, and 26.1% for non-Hispanic black adults.
- Non-Hispanic white adults were more likely to engage in regular leisure-time physical activity than Hispanic adults and non-Hispanic black adults.
