

Tularemia	6 Cases 2 Hospitalized 1 Death
Ehrlichiosis (HME)	9 Cases 8 Hospitalized 1 Death




Distribution of Tickborne Illness by County of Residence; Oklahoma 2003

2003 Oklahoma WNV Cases: Epidemiology

- 78 Human cases of WNV infection
- □ 35 (45%) female 44 (55%) male
- Median age = 45 years old; range = 11 88 yrs
- 45 (58%) hospitalized; 0 deaths
- Variety of presenting syndromes:
 - 48 meningoencephalitis 2 Paralysis
 - 23 "West Nile Fever"
 - 7 unspecified
 - Dates of onset: July 09 October 09, 2003

Dead Wild Bird Surveillance; 2003-Oklahoma




- Limited geographic surveillance areas to locales with mosquito control capabilities
- Total of 764 birds tested
- 401WNV-positive by rt-PCR of organ pool (52.5% positivity)
- 275 (68.5%) blue jays, 109 crows, 8 cardinals, 4 grackles, 2 Eastern bluebirds, 2 hawks, and one unknown type.

Oklahoma Dead Wild Bird Surveillance; 2002 - 2003 Comparison




- Parallel temporal trend
 - First detected WN+ bird collected 2nd week of July; bimodal peak of dead bird positivity (mid-Aug and mid-Sept)
- Sightings/reports of dead blue jays high predictive value in eastern OK
- Limiting testing resources to corvids and birds of prey was effective
- Best overall surveillance indicator of human risk



Equine Surveillance Oklahoma; 2003

- First surveillance event in OK in 2003
- Overall temporal incidence trend similar to previous year
 - >80% cases have onset in Sept & Oct
- Marked decrease in lab-confirmed cases compared to previous year (169 vs 965)
- Foci of transmission in NE corner of state







WN Vectors in Oklahoma

- Culex tarsalis
 - most prevalent in the west
 - highest WNV vector competency rating
 - also transmits SLE and WEE
 - egg-adult cycle in 4 10 days during hot summer months
 - Culex pipiens quinquefasciatus
 - "Southern house mosquito"
- Container breeder with great skill in gaining indoor access
 - SLE vector





Mosquito Surveillance in Oklahoma; 2003

- Sporadic trapping from July thru October 2003
- □ 12 different counties
- 5,902 adult female mosquitoes of 27 different species collected
- New identifications
 - Culex coronator in Pittsburg county
 - Ochlerotatus muelleri larvae found in ODOT concrete testing tank; 9/23/03






Mosquito Surveillance in Oklahoma; 2003

- □ First WN+ pool collected
 July 17
- □ *14 WN+ pools*
 - 5 C. quinquefasciatus
 - 1 A. albopictus
 - 8 C. pipiens/restuans
- Labor and resource intensive
- Limited # entomological experts in state to sort and ID
- Limited surveillance value for West Nile and SLE at this time















Distribution of Human WNV Infection Oklahoma 2003




