
Supplemental Mosquito Control In Texas

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS)

- DSHS received \$1,108,618.00 to assist mosquito control programs in 22 southeast Texas counties that were adversely affected by Hurricane Rita
- \$1,053.188.00 in assistance was offered to enhance existing mosquito control programs or the creation of new mosquito control programs based on the principles of IMM

- Developed allocation of funding for each county
- Developed contract deliverables
- Developed letters that were sent to the County Judges offering funds



Allocation of Funds for the 22 counties

Allocation of Funding

 DSHS Work Group developed a Points System for the Allocation of the Funding to the 22 counties

- Each of the 22 counties were awarded 1.0 point, which had a value of \$17,700.46
- Additional points for each county were added based on documentation of
 - Mosquito Control Program
 - Documented Landing Rate Counts
 - West Nile virus Surveillance
 - Community Education

 Mosquito Control Program 0.5 point for partial area of county 1.0 point for entire county Documented Landing Rate Counts 1.0 point for 1-20 per minute 2.0 points for 21-41 per minute 3.0 points for 42-62 per minute • 4.0 points for 63+ per minute

West Nile virus Surveillance
1.0 point for 1-75 submissions
2.0 points for 76-151 submissions
3.0 points for 152+ submissions
Community Education
0.5 point for program

 Total points for each county were tabulated and multiplied by \$17,700.46 to determine allocation funding for inclusion into letters to the County Judges

 Initial allocations ranged from \$17,700.46 to \$123,903.23

Letters to County Judges

- A brief introduction to the availability of the funding and the DSHS contract requirements for receiving the funding
 - Submission of mosquitoes to DSHS for arboviral testing
 - Documented mosquito landing rate counts
 - Documented community education activities
 - Documented actions regarding investigation of mosquito complaints

Letters to County Judges

- 11 counties choose to participate, submitted budgets and signed contracts with DSHS
- Final allocations ranged from \$53,551.93 -\$160,655.80
