

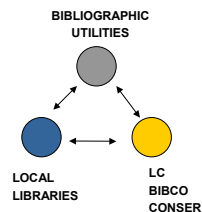

Architecting *it* for Sharing Metadata & Future Directions of PCC

- **Wolven's question about cooperation**
"How can we take advantage of each other's work to pursue a common goal?" (Or, What does it mean to cooperate in this new environment?)

 - "sanctioned authority data"
 - "leading others to create and share of such data"
- **PCC Strategic Directions (SD1-SD5)**

The Record

- What is the authoritative record?
