HARBOR ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Created in 1979 (Wisconsin Administrative Rule Trans 28)

Port projects typically include: dock reconstruction, mooring structure replacement, dredging, and the construction of facilities to hold dredged material. Grant applications are accepted on a semi-annual basis on August 1 and February 1. All commercial ports in the state are potentially eligible for funding through the HAP.

To be eligible for funding:

- The project must benefit facilities that are used for cargo transfer, ship building, commercial fishing or regular ferry service;
- The applicant must be a local unit of government or a private owner of a harbor facility;
- The project must pass a rigorous benefit-cost analysis; and
- The project must have been identified in a current Three-Year Harbor Development Plan.

HARBOR ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- Developed from WCMP initiatives
- The advisory council
 - Wisconsin Department of Commerce
 - Wisconsin Coastal Management Program
 - and shall include 2 or 3 other persons familiar with water transportation (US ACOE and UW Sea Grant)

Wisconsin Waterfront Initiative

Part of Governor Doyle greater economic development plan.


