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### Federal Consistency & Program Changes

- Federal Consistency Workshop
  - Tentative plan: Chicago early in 2009

- Program Change Rulemaking
  - Comment period for Advanced Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (ANPR) ended Aug. 18

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 Proposed rules will not be out before the new administration

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## **Program Change Rulemaking**

- 1. Establish a clearer and more efficient and transparent process for program change review
- 2. Describe clearer approval/disapproval criteria and how these apply
- 3. Using the statutory language of the CZMA, including time lines, extensions, and preliminary approval
- 4. Keeping the "routine" concept to streamline the process for truly routine changes, but do away with "routine program changes (RPCs)" and "Amendments" and replace with just "program changes"

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### **Program Change Rulemaking**

- 5. Removing the "substantial" evaluations currently done by states and replace with just describing what the change is to the program.
- 6. Establishing use of NEPA categorical exclusions
- 7. Submitting underline/strikeout documents showing changes to previously approved policies
- 8. Creating a program change checklist that states would submit to ease state and NOAA paperwork burdens and promote consistent submissions and NOAA analyses

#### **Program Change Rulemaking: Comments**

- Received comments from 5 organizations
  - Navy, CSO, Delaware, Oregon, San Francisco BCDC
  - www.coastalmanagement.noaa.gov/consistency/programchange.html
- General comments:
  - Current process and requirements are unclear, inefficient, inconsistent, cumbersome, burdensome, and time consuming. The result is a backlog of changes.
  - Overall, strong support for revising the program change regulations.
- Navy's comments very detailed; recommendations focused on:
  - Desire to be more informed about proposed program changes (improve notification, transparency and clarity).
  - Need for access to all of the state policies that are in effect.

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## **CELCP Update**

- CELCP new staff and regional organization
- FY 2009 Competition
  - 54 proposals
  - 27 states/territories
  - \$79 million in requests
  - 10 from GL states
- FY 2010 Competition
  - December funding notice anticipated



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### **CELCP Update continued**

- CELCP Plans
  - Most states have submitted plans
  - NY has an approved plan
- CELCP Projects
  - Numerous GL projects since CELCP began
  - Five ongoing grants



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# **Coastal Strategy**

- OMB told NOAA to better integrate coastal programs
  - OCRM, Coastal Services Center, Sea Grant, NMFS Habitat Office, National Centers for Coastal and Ocean Science (NCCOS)
- "Coastal" is one of 6 themes NOAA will present to new administration
  - High visibility for coastal management
- Three priority issues:
  - 1. Coastal Hazards and Climate Change
  - 2. Competing Coastal Uses and Habitat Loss
  - 3. Coastal Pollution and Human Health Effects
- NOAA's Capabilities: Science, Capacity Building, Education and Extension, and Management

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## **CZMA Reauthorization**

- Hope to have a NOAA cleared bill by November
- Will then hold informational Hill briefings



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## **Audit Update**

- Gov't Accountability Office (GAO) interviewed many OCRM staff and all state managers
- Report being finalized; OCRM provided comments
- Major recommendations
  - Congress reconsider funding cap
  - NOAA review and revise (as needed) grant regulations and practices
  - NOAA create measurable targets and process for ensuring accurate performance measure data; focus 312 evaluations on progress toward meeting measurable goals

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
