FY-2009 Performance Plan

## **INCREASED SAFETY**

- By June 1, 2009, identify Runway Safety Area (RSA) improvement projects to be considered for Airport Improvement Program (AIP) funding in FY-10.
- 2. By June 30, 2009, update and submit RSA completion status report to Headquarters.
- 3. By September 30, 2009, physically complete seven (7) Priority RSA improvements (excluding navigational aids).
- By June 30, 2009, update and submit Non-priority RSA completion status report for RSA improvements remaining to be completed by 2015 to Headquarters.
- 5. Conduct airport safety inspections per the regional FY-09 work plan.
- 6. By July 30, 2009, develop regional work plan for conducting airport safety inspections for FY-10 and submit to Headquarters.
- 7. Provide monthly reports to Headquarters on the implementation of enhanced taxiway centerlines at airports with less than 1.5 million annual enplanements but more than 370,000 annual enplanements.
- 8. Provide monthly progress reports to Headquarters on the implementation of enhanced taxiway centerlines at airports with less than 370,000 annual enplanements.
- 9. By September 30, 2009, request all certificated airports to implement recurrent training for all contractor and tenant vehicle operators with movement area access.
- 10. By the established obligation deadline, issue AIP grants totaling AGL's share of the Wide Area Augmentation System/Localizer Performance with Vertical Guidance (WAAS/LPV) Survey discretionary set-aside for WAAS/LPV approach surveys in FY-09.
- Track Vehicle/Pedestrian Deviations (V/PD's) that meet the Business Plan criterion (including A, B, C and D).
- 12. Implement regional work plan in support of Runway Safety Action Team (RSAT) FY-09 regional activities.

- 13. By September 30, 2009, support and participate in local RSAT meetings.
- 14. By September 1, 2009, meet with the Runway Safety Office and agree on locations for FY-10 RSAT meetings.
- 15. By the established obligation deadline, issue grants for the AIP portion of approved RSAT recommendations included in the Airport Capital Improvement Plan (ACIP) for FY-09.
- Track regional special initiatives related to safety.
- 17. By June 1, 2009, identify standards-related projects to be considered for AIP funding in FY-10.
- 18. By the established obligation deadline, issue grants for the AIP portion of airport standards projects for the current year.

## **GREATER CAPACITY**

- By June 1, 2009, identify capacity enhancing projects at Chicago metro area airports (other than Operational Evolution Partnership (OEP) airports) to be considered for AIP funding in FY-10.
- 20. By the established obligation deadline, issue grants for capacity enhancing projects at Chicago metro area airports (other than OEP airports) in the current year.
- 21. By November 2008, ensure that Chicago O'Hare International Airport (ORD) Runway 9L/27R will be commissioned and available for use.
- 22. By September 2009, ensure that ORD Runway 9L/27R has full OEP operation capabilities.
- 23. By September 2009, ensure that ORD Runway 10/28 (extension) has full OEP operational capabilities.
- 24. By June 1, 2009, identify runway pavement projects for AIP funding in FY-10 (including any required environmental processing).

25. By the established obligation deadline, issue grants for runway pavement projects in the ACIP for the current year.

## **ORGANIZATIONAL EXCELLENCE**

- 26. By the end of each quarter, review and analyze the previous quarters Cost Accounting System report to ensure standardization and identify potential problems.
- 27. By March 31, 2009, identify two categories of expenditure for analysis in terms of cost efficiency.
- 28. By June 30, 2009, establish baseline data, metrics and targets for cost containment or efficiency improvements for FY-10 to FY-12.
- 29. Submit American Customer Satisfaction Index Survey Action Plan progress reports on a quarterly basis.
- 30. Program 90% of available AIP discretionary funds within 60 calendar days after Discretionary funds are made available to the regions.
- 31. Complete monthly reconciliation in accordance with established deadlines, including management review.
- 32. By September 30, 2009, ensure that the region is meeting the grant outlay rate.
- 33. Report quarterly to Headquarters on steps taken to help achieve the outlay rate metric.
- 34. By September 1, 2009, update the forward looking analysis of existing and future Letter of Intent commitments and requests.
- 35. By November 14, 2008, directly link employee performance plans to FAA strategic goals and to the Airports Division business plan.
- 36. Through September 1, 2009, maintain a level of 95% of all critical operating system patches.
- 37. By August 15, 2009, ensure that all employees and contactors have completed both Security Awareness Virtual Instruction training requirements.
- 38. By August 30, 2008, each Airports District Office will conduct at least one general aviation land use inspection and one associated educational outreach.

- 39. Close or otherwise respond to any open audits within 120 days of receipt by the Airports District Office, except in extenuating circumstances as approved by the Division Manager.
- 40. By June 30, 2009, complete an internal audit of the AIP grant program at each Airports District Office.
- 41. By July 31, 2009, close out 50% of the open Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) applications that were both physically and financially complete as of October 1, 2008.
- 42. Generate a monthly PFC expiration report.
- 43. By June 1, 2009, identify noise compatibility projects for AIP funding in FY-09.
- 44. By the established obligation deadline, issue grants that will ensure that 1,900 people (residents and school students) in DNL 65dB or greater receive benefits from noise compatibility projects.
- 45. By March 31, 2009, complete regional review of Noise Land Reuse Plans.
