

As a mother of two small boys who moved to a home in an established neighborhood for the schools and park 5 years ago, I am very unhappy with the increasing traffic directly over my house! It used to be I couldn't hear the planes while I was in the house with the windows closed: Now I can. Keep in mind that I am deaf in one ear! I more very frequently have to stop conversations in my backyard because the larger planes are flying lower and many right over us. We play in the yard a lot, but are less likely to invite kids over due to the scary noise.

We moved here realizing there was a small airport nearby, but the noise levels and activity have increased dramatically. It's as though we've moved out by DIA. These low flying larger planes (I guess these are "Stage 1") do not belong so close over our neighborhood. If we were to sell, I can imagine people being turned off when they hear the current noise levels here.

My husband and I support all the 12 study recommendations, most vehemently putting the big, noisy planes out of here, and not allowing them to fly so low over the neighborhood.

- Except planes should be East of Peoria, not over the homes adjacent to Cherry Creek State Park. I think that is the "010 fan" or something like that.
- Pilots who break the rules should be fined significantly.
