SAVANNAH RIVER SITE EMPLOYEE UNITED WAY CAMPAIGN RAISES OVER \$1.7 MILLION

AIKEN, S.C. (Oct. 21) – SRS employees recently celebrated raising over \$1.7 million for area United Way agencies.

Savannah River Nuclear Solutions (SRNS) and Washington Savannah River Company (WSRC) Team employees donated a grand total of \$ 1,784,228 during their annual employee United Way campaign, about 105 percent of the \$1.7 million goal.

"SRS employees continue to recognize and respond to the needs of our communities and are very committed to improving our region," said SRNS President Chuck Munns. "Even in an uncertain economy, our employees are very generous, not only by giving of their money, but also by giving of their time."
