

2008 CARE Financial Education Outreach Initiative

The Coalition of African American Regulatory Employees (CARE) organization at the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC) has chosen financial education as the focus of this year's Black History Month celebration and beyond. With this in mind, CARE has launched a 2008 Financial Education Outreach Initiative that will run from Tuesday, February 5 through Wednesday, April 30, 2008.

Under the initiative, themed "Our Communities Count," CARE members will conduct financial education presentations to middle school, high school, and college students in educational institutions throughout the United States. Through such efforts, CARE hopes 1.) to provide students with an understanding of basic financial principles and 2.) for an understanding of these principles to remain with students in the years ahead.
