# II. TEST DATE

The Oral Analysis/Presentation and Structured Oral Interview portions of the test will be tentatively held during the 5<sup>th</sup> week of February 2008. The Short Answer Essay and Written Multiple-Choice portions of the test will be administered at a later date. This page will be updated as information becomes available.

Approximately two weeks before the test date, candidates will receive a notice in the mail that shows the date, time, location and room to which they should report for their examination. Candidates are to bring the Notification Card, two forms of identification and two pencils to the Examination Center. Pens and highlighters are optional. One of the forms of identification **must** include a photograph. Candidates will not be permitted to bring this Orientation Guide into the Examination Center. Candidates should map out a route in advance of the examination date and plan to arrive at the Examination Center early because <u>no one</u> will be admitted late.
