H.R. 710, to provide that criminal penalties do not apply to paired donations of human kidneys, and for other purposes. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110-144)

H.R. 2408, to designate the Department of Veterans Affairs outpatient clinic in Green Bay, Wisconsin, as the "Milo C. Huempfer Department of

H.R. 3315, to provide that the great hall of the Capitol Visitor Center shall be known as Emancipation Hall. Signed on December 18, 2007. (Public Law 110-139)

H.R. 6, to move the United States toward greater energy independence and security, to increase the production of clean renewable fuels, to protect consumers, to increase the efficiency of products, buildings, and vehicles, to promote research on and deploy greenhouse gas capture and storage options, and to improve the energy performance of the Federal

Veterans Affairs Outpatient Clinic”. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–145)

H.R. 2671, to designate the United States courthouse located at 301 North Miami Avenue, Miami, Florida, as the “C. Clyde Atkins United States Courthouse”. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–146)

H.R. 3703, to amend section 5112(p)(1)(A) of title 31, United States Code, to allow an exception from the \$1 coin dispensing capability requirement for certain vending machines. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–147)

H.R. 3739, to amend the Arizona Water Settlements Act to modify the requirements for the statement of findings. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–148)

H.J. Res. 72, making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2008, and for other purposes. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–149)

S. 597, to amend title 39, United States Code, to extend the authority of the United States Postal Service to issue a semipostal to raise funds for breast

cancer research. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–150)

S. 888, to amend section 1091 of title 18, United States Code, to allow the prosecution of genocide in appropriate circumstances. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–151)

S. 2174, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 175 South Monroe Street in Tiffin, Ohio, as the “Paul E. Gillmor Post Office Building”. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–152)

S. 2371, to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to make technical corrections. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–153)

S. 2484, to rename the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development as the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. Signed on December 21, 2007. (Public Law 110–154)
