Products from these pilots will include intake and assessment tools, outreach, training and resource materials, reports, surveys and project evaluations. Streamlining efforts will included shared intakes, assessment and referral protocols with other agencies, and coordinated efforts with State Health Information and Assistance Programs and the state Medicaid agency.

Target Population:

- Individuals who are older and individuals with a disability, including cognitive disabilities, in the targeted communities have an identifiable single point of entry to long-term care supports
- Increase in the percentage of individuals served through the Aging and Disability Resource Centers who report an improvement in their ability to access long-term care supports
