Collections News

Save America's Treasures Project

Professional conservation of our Revolutionary War materials continues at the Conservation Center in Philadelphia. Several bound volumes have returned and await preservation microfilming: Damages by the British in Bergen, Burlington and Somerset Counties, 1776-1782 [three of six "Damages" volumes sent]; Letterbook of Deputy Quartermaster General Moore Furman, 1778; Order Book of British Army Officer George Crawford, 1778; and Minute Book of the Burlington County Court of General Quarter Sessions, 1764-1787. We plan to produce electronic images of the conserved documents from the new microfilm, and make the same available to researchers on the State Archives' website. We have already added a new component to the site to celebrate our monumental *Save America's Treasures* project and to post regular updates on the status of specific collections. Kudos to Collection Manager Ellen R. Callahan and her staff for their ongoing progress on the project, and to Publications staff Lois Bredlow and Veronica Calder for the excellent website pages.

Searchable Databases

We are excited to announce the posting of our third online database, which indexes the state's

marriage returns from the beginning of the period of state-level filing, 1 May 1848, through the end of May 1867. The search engine provides access to over 70,000 marriage entries from all counties. We ask for your patience when searching, as we know that the currently available website software can be very slow. We are implementing hardware and software upgrades and hope to vastly improve search capabilities (including speed and reporting parameters) during the upcoming months.

Exploring Your Jersey Roots III

NOTE: The State Archives and Genealogical Society of New Jerseyhave announced that the June 3rd program has been canceled.

This Wednesday's presentation concludes the evening lectures in our series *Exploring Your Jersey Roots III*, which began on April 26th in co-sponsorship with the Genealogical Society of New Jersey (GSNJ). Our *Jersey Roots* finale, which is also GSNJ's Spring Program, is planned for Saturday, June 3rd. The all-day event will include two tracks: one featuring four presentations on military research, the other an "Ask the Experts" track including both panel discussions and one-on-one sessions with genealogical professionals. 1796 Archives Uncovered

On April 6th, the State Archives' staff and constituents enjoyed a fun and quite unanticipated press event celebrating the discovery of the foundations of the original State Archives building beneath the foreground of the present State House. The 1796 structure housed the vaults of the Secretary of State and Supreme Court Clerk, containing the core of the present State Archives' colonial record holdings. It was the second public office building to be constructed by the State, following the 1792 State House. Karl J. Niederer, Division Director and master of ceremonies, planned the event in coordination with Hunter Research Associates, the site archaeologists. Remarks were given by representatives of all three branches of state government, including Secretary of State Nina Mitchell Wells, Supreme Court Clerk Stephen W. Townsend, and State Senator Leonard Lance. Archaeologist Ian Burrow, representing Hunter Research Associates, entertained the crowd with his references to how the State Archives' own collections were used to locate and map the 1796 structure's stone walls as well as its intact privy pit. As Burrow noted, "we're using the archives in the Archives to help us find the physical Archives in the ground that once held the archives that are now in the Archives!"

Tales from the Search Rooms

Betty Childs Klaviter of Lansing, MI, wrote us about her recent genealogical discoveries at the State Archives, with staff assistance from Laurice Niceler. The challenge was to locate the marriage and death information of a relative, Mrs. Marie Smith, who was known to have died in New Jersey sometime in 1894. Through estate papers, Marie's residence and husband's name were found, leading to discovery of the marriage record, her death certificate as well as that of her husband, and other documentation. Ms. Klaviter: we look forward to your next visit. We're sure there's more to find!

Reference Archivist Catherine Medich recounted an interesting Search Room experience in which a patron visiting from upstate New York discovered four newspaper accounts of her husband's great-grandfather's death in 1912. The genealogical windfall began with a search in Sussex County Coroner's papers, which included an original death certificate apparently not filed with the State's vital records. This revealed that the ancestor died after falling from a barn during an attempt to escape from the county almshouse! While it wasn't what the patron had expected to learn, she was thrilled nonetheless.
