Purpose:	Hispanic Americans are a diverse people in languages and in culture. This course provides an overview of issues that providers need to consider in their planning and provision of services to the Hispanic client. Using case
	examples, the author provides a review of PTSD symptoms, discusses the role of primary/secondary language, family, role, assessment considerations and other topics in order to familiarize or enhance the provider's trans-cultural competencies. This course is meant to enhance the provider's trans-cultural competencies in the planning and provision of services to Hispanic-American clients.
