The workshop is supported by the Federal-Provincial-Territorial Assistant Deputy Minister Electricity Working Group, the U.S. Department of Energy and the U.S. Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

The Bilateral ERO Oversight Group, which includes representatives of the above-mentioned organizations, is addressing key issues for the transition from the current, North American Electric Reliability Council (NERC) to an Electricity Reliability Organization (ERO) that can work on an international basis. On December 8, 2004, the Oversight Group conducted a workshop in Toronto, Ontario, which explored the international aspects of implementing an ERO as a truly bi-national organization.

As a follow-up of the December 8, 2004 conference, the April 19, 2005 workshop will focus on the international aspects of issues related to Regional Entities that receive a delegation of responsibility from the ERO. The workshop will provide an opportunity to bring regulators and stakeholders from both countries together to share their views on these issues.

**Format:** The workshop will commence with presentations on today and tomorrow's regional reliability organizations and tomorrow's regional entities. Four panel discussions, with focused questions, will follow. Each panel will commence with the panel facilitator giving a brief introduction and explanation of the issue and questions, followed by each panelist providing a brief summary of their position on the issue. The panel facilitator will then pose more specific questions for discussion by the panelists. At the end of each panel the audience will be permitted to raise questions.
