REVITALIZING MONTANA'S RIVERS

- Bozeman Fish Health Center developed a reliable DNA based diagnostic method to detect whirling disease using non-lethal sampling methods. Completed sampling and analysis of two trout populations.
- Completed comprehensive fish health assessment on captive and free-ranging pallid sturgeon.

PARTNERS FOR FISH AND WILDLIFE PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

- Worked with more than 60 landowners to voluntarily restore/enhance over 25,000 acres of wetland, upland, and riparian habitats on private lands in 2005.
- Private land projects benefit fluvial Arctic grayling, Westslope cutthroat trout, grizzly bear, gray wolf, sage grouse, ferruginous hawk, and numerous species of shorebirds, waterfowl, and grassland nesting birds.

NATIONAL FISH HATCHERIES IN MONTANA

- USFWS worked toward restoration of the fluvial Arctic grayling by developing broodstock and stocking progeny.
