REVITALIZING NEBRASKA'S RIVERS

- Surveyed portions of the Missouri River for the presence of zebra mussels, an aquatic nuisance species, which can cause millions of dollars in damages to intake pipes, water filtration equipment, and electric generating plants.

PARTNERS FOR FISH AND WILDLIFE PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

- Worked with more than 60 landowners to voluntarily restore/enhance over 20,000 acres of wetland, upland, and riparian habitats on private lands in 2005.
- Private land projects benefit whooping crane, sandhill crane, least tern, piping plover, and numerous species of wading birds, shorebirds, waterfowl, and grassland nesting birds.

WORKING WITH OUR PARTNERS

- Working with Saline Wetlands conservation Partnership to preserve and protect 4,000 acres of the Eastern Nebraska Saline Wetlands (the rarest habitat in Nebraska).
