PARTNERS FOR FISH AND WILDLIFE PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

- Worked with 12 landowners to voluntarily restore/enhance over 40,000 acres of wetland, upland, and riparian habitats on private lands in 2005.
- Private land projects benefit Yellowstone cutthroat trout, sage grouse, and a large number of shorebird, waterfowl, and grassland nesting bird species.

FISH AND WILDLIFE HABITAT IMPROVEMENTS FOR WYOMING

- Provided fish passage access to 38 miles of historic spawning and rearing habitat in Mill Creek by modifying an existing irrigation diversion dam. This project benefited Yellowstone Cutthroat trout.
- Assessed habitat and population status of threatened sauger in the Wind River Drainage: identified critical spawning habitat and stream flow recommendations for best management practices for protection of this species to prevent future need for listing under the Endangered Species Act.

NATIONAL FISH HATCHERIES IN WYOMING

- Maintained broodstock and reintroduced 2,597 captive reared endangered Wyoming toads into the wild to meet recovery plan objectives.
- Stocked nearly 34,000 native Yellowstone cutthroat trout into Bull and Dinwoody Lakes and Dinwoody Creek and other high mountain wilderness lakes to enhance native stocks on the Wind River Reservation.
