

# **Minneapolis Quarantine Station**

## **Jurisdiction**

The jurisdiction of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Minneapolis Quarantine Station includes all ports in Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Nebraska.

## **Quarantine Station Activities**

- Respond to reports of illness or death on airplanes, maritime vessels (cargo), and other conveyances at international ports of entry in the states of Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Nebraska.
- Partner with other federal agencies, local and state health departments, private medical providers, and hospitals in preparedness activities related to quarantine and isolation at U.S. ports of entry.
- Develop planning logistics, along with public health partners, for emergency public health and bioterrorism response.
- Participate in teams and workgroups for CDC's Division of Global Migration and Quarantine, Quarantine and Border Health Services Branch.
