Thanks for obtaining this annual pass for day use in the National Forests and Grasslands in Texas.

This pass entitles you to unlimited day use in participating fee areas forest wide for the year 2009!

Recreation day-use fee areas in the National Forests and Grasslands in Texas include picnic areas, swim beaches, and boat launches. Visit and explore some of the most beautiful places in east Texas.

What happens with the fees I pay?

This annual pass is part of the new Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Act, approved by Congress in 2006. Now your fees stay in the National Forests and Grasslands in Texas to help maintain and improve the recreation areas you enjoy. Your money may be used to upgrade facilities, improve information and customer service, and provide interpretation and environmental education. ***Please let us know what improvements you would like to see!***

How do I display this pass?

Place this pass on your front driver's side windshield.

At designated fee sites, an annual pass or an individual day-use pass must be displayed in each vehicle during each visit.

What are the benefits?

- Unlimited visits to recreation day-use fee areas, forest-wide, for the calendar year 2009.
- No filling out individual day-use envelopes, no worries with correct change!
- The Annual Day-Use Permit is designed to save money for the frequent forest visitor.
- Areas run by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on Sam Rayburn Reservoir and Town Bluff Reservoir, selected areas on the Kisatchie National Forest, and Townsend (operated and maintained by permit), all honor this annual day- use pass.

Are there any exceptions?

This annual pass is honored at fee areas operated by the National Forests and Grasslands in Texas. Some areas run by private concession do not participate.

What is NOT covered by this pass?

- Fees for any overnight use.
- Fees to reserve a picnic pavilion.
- Fees in other national forests across the United States.
