WHEREAS, The Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) was established by Congress in 1977 to ensure that depository institutions assist in meeting the credit needs of the communities in which they operate; and

WHEREAS, Low and moderate-income neighborhoods, which are most in need of community development assistance, are also the same areas that benefit the most from this act; and

WHEREAS, The Office of Thrift Supervision (OTS) has already changed the definition of a "small bank" to those institutions with less than one billion dollars in assets; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) has proposed changing the definition of a "small bank" to those institutions with less than one billion dollars in assets; and

WHEREAS, As a result of these rule changes, only banks with assets over one billion dollars will have to conform to the CRA guidelines that evaluate banks' record of community service and community investment; and

WHEREAS, Furthermore, the OTS has proposed a second rule change to the CRA that would change the way "large banks" are evaluated; and

WHEREAS, The adoption of this proposed rule change would protect even "large banks" from having to invest in low and moderate-income communities; and

WHEREAS. The cumulative effect of the aforementioned rule changes will leave banks with less incentive to invest money in low and moderate-income communities; and

WHEREAS, As a result, such communities could be hurt by a decrease in affordable housing and the reduced availability of economic development loans; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED. That this Legislative Body pause in its deliberations to urge Congress to act against proposed rule changes by the Office of Thrift Supervision and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation that would undermine the Community Reinvestment Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution, suitably engressed, be transmitted to each member of the Congress of the United States from the State of New York.
