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New Advisory Circular (AC) for Airport Marking Standards

This AC incorporates guidance on the use of enhanced taxiway centerline markings, surface painted holding position signs, the extension of runway holding position markings onto paved taxiway shoulders and other markings.

The enhanced taxiway centerline is being adopted as the standard for commercial service airports that have 1.5 million or more passenger enplanements in a calendar year. A list of airport names is attached. The effective date for these changes at the attached airports will be effective June 30, 2008, and will be the only means of compliance to 14 CFR part 139.

Similarly, the extension of the runway holding position markings onto paved shoulders is being adopted as the only acceptable means of compliance with Part 139 for airports regularly served by aircraft in Aircraft Design Groups 5 and 6, and is also effective June 30, 2008. These standards are optional for all other airports.
