- Teachers select one of five lessons. Each is taught by an Archivist from the National Archives— Central Plains Region: *Introduction to Teaching with Documents, Civil War in the Border States, the American West-Westward Expansion, Online Resources for Educators at the National Archives*, and *Students Experiencing History Online*.
- Using the document camera, students can examine documents, photos, and 3-dimensional artifacts. This serves as a way to enlarge a document for easy reading in the classroom. In addition, electronic or hard copies of most items are available for further use.
