Title: Introduction to Teaching with Documents

Audience: Educators

Description: In this introductory program, educators learn about the Teaching with Documents

web site, and participate in a hands-on document analysis activity.

Title: Civil War in the Border States **Audience:** Middle/High School Students

Description: The Civil War wasn't just fought in the East. Learn about the Civil War in Kansas and Missouri. Staff will introduce students to several historical documents from the National Archives – Central Plains Region that illustrate life in the region during the Civil War.

Title: The American West and Westward Expansion

Audience: Middle/High School Students

Description: From homesteading and immigration to General George Armstrong Custer and the Wounded Knee tragedy the American West tells the tale of experience had by many.
