Waco Lake to repair flood damaged roads in three park areas

FORT WORTH, Texas – The U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Fort Worth District at Waco Lake announced today that roads in three park areas that were damaged during the 2007 flood event will be repaired.

The flood event caused damage to the road and parking area that serve the boat launching facility at Flat Rock Park. The park will be closed to complete the repair work from May 12 through May 31. Road repairs at Reynolds Creek and Speegleville Parks will require some “one-lane” traffic patterns within each park. Reynolds Creek Park will undergo repair work from May 12 through June 7 and repair work will begin at Speegleville Park on May 27 and end June 10.

Visitors are asked to use extra caution as they drive through Reynolds Creek and Speegleville Park areas during these times. The Corps has worked hard to minimize park disruptions and asks for your patience and understanding during these time periods.
