
FIGHTING THE FIRES OF HATE America and the Nazi Book Burnings

Did you know?

In the years after her college graduation, Helen Keller became a socialist and suffragist. In her writings she championed the disabled, pacifism, improved conditions for industrial workers, and women's voting rights.

Helen Keller, herself blind and deaf, donated her German royalties to a fund for German warblind veterans. Nonetheless, her socialist and anti-war writing was burned by the Nazis in May 1933. Her open letter of protest, published in the New York Times and elsewhere, warned the German people that the burning of books could not eradicate ideas.
