Hyatt Lake Recreation Complex Tenting Area Closes For Site Renovations

Medford, OR, May 24, 2007 – The Hyatt Lake Recreation Complex walk-in tenting area will be closed for renovations until August 18, 2007. Improvements to the area include new electrical service and renovation of the existing restroom building. This will not affect the remainder of the recreation complex including fee campsites at Hyatt Lake and Wildcat campgrounds, a group camping area, a group day use shelter, a fire circle, restroom facilities, showers, a trailer dump station, a ball field, boat ramps and dock facilities, a fish cleaning station, a sand volleyball court, a basketball goal, horseshoe pits, a children's playground, and an equestrian campsite.

The improvements will include new partitions, heaters, fixtures and addition of showers for campers. Additional information on recreation sites and opportunities managed by the Medford District Bureau of Land Management can be found at:
