Pursuant to Commission Regulation 40.6, the Chicago Board of Trade (CBOT®) hereby submits the following:

- Modifications to the previously established Electronic (e-cbot) Permit Program, which will allow non-European based firms to qualify for e-cbot permits under the following requirements:
  - Applicants must register for the permit program by March 31, 2004;
  - Entity must have a clearing relationship with a CBOT clearing member;
  - Firms may conduct non-clearing business only and cannot be futures commission merchants;
  - Entities that act as brokers for third parties are not eligible for the permit program;
  - Entity must lease a minimum of 5 Full or Associate Memberships by June 30, 2004.

The referenced permit program, a temporary (18 month) initiative, was established to facilitate access to the e-cbot electronic trading platform by European entities. In view of the strong interest in this program which has been shown by non-European firms, the Exchange is revising the program to allow non-European based firms to qualify.

The CBOT intends to implement these revisions one day after the Commission's receipt of this filing.
