Fire Closure Lifted on BLM Lands in Washington State

Spokane – Effective midnight on Monday, October 9, 2006, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is ending the regulated fire closure on public lands it manages in the state of Washington. The fire closure is being lifted due to cooler temperatures and increased precipitation.

Scott Boyd, Fire Management Officer for the Spokane District, asks the public to use caution when operating motorized vehicles on roads and trails that have areas of high grass and vegetation and to ensure campfires are out before leaving the area.

The BLM manages more land – 261 million surface acres – than any other Federal agency. Most of this public land is located in 12 Western States, including Alaska. The Bureau, with a budget of about \$1.8 billion, also administers 700 million acres of subsurface mineral estate throughout the nation.
